Despite an intense whale watching activity in the bay of Los Gigantes, the surface remained clean, and only two bottles were caught near the harbour.

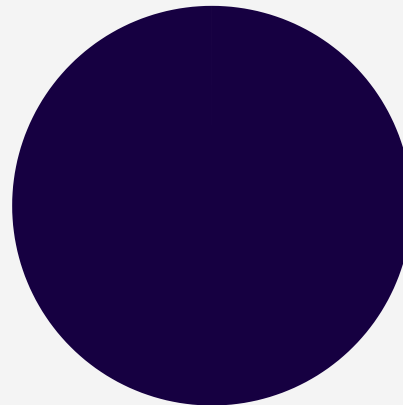
